Course Description: Black and white photography is a studio course involving technique and creative aspects of black and white photography. Media include 35mm SLR camera, film, photo chemicals, photo paper, enlarger and necessary equipment to produce prints are used to complete works in portraits, landscapes, still life, figure and perspective. Students will study the development of photography as an art medium, contrast, lighting, composition and the quality of their work. Emphasis is placed on the students developing their own originality and style.

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Homework Policy: Students must complete and submit assignments by their due date. I will accept late work for ¾ credit for up to 7 days after the original due date. Students must complete assignments in a timely manner in order to stay on top of the work load for this class.

Assessment: Students will be evaluated through t use of rubrics, critiques, participation (crits, use of class time, discussions, clean up), artist statements, and self-reflections. Students will be prepared and know in advance what is expected of their performance so they are able to exceed performance goals.

CONDUCT

Students are responsible for conducting themselves in a responsible manner, which is appropriate to their age and level of maturity. Student responsibilities for achieving a positive learning environment in school or school related activities include:

- 3. Being dressed appropriately.
- 4. Showing respect toward others.
- 5. Behaving in a responsible manner.
- 6. Paying required fees and fines and/or fulfilling all obligations.
- 7. Abiding by the code of conduct.
- 8. Obeying all school rules, including safety rules.

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- 9. Seeking change in school policies and regulations in an orderly and responsible manner, through appropriate channels.
- 10. Cooperating with staff investigations of disciplinary cases and volunteering information relating to a serious offense.
- 11. Students are not allowed to be in the school building before/after school hours (including delayed openings and early dismissals) without staff supervision. Students who violate these rules will be subject to disciplinary action and shall be referred, when appropriate, to legal authorities for violation of the law.

Students are **NOT** permitted to carry backpacks or handbags during the school day. Only drawstring/nylon sport pack/bags are permitted. School administrators are permitted to allow exceptions to the provisions set forth below in cases of special circumstances or school spirit days.
